Maybe you will see wildlife and birds, for sure you will see native plants , breath fresh air, and experience nature with wonderful people.

***Escape to the Headlands***, come take a hike or just hang out near the staging area to enjoy the outdoors. From a gentle sloped half to one mile to a steep inclined one mile or even a great 4 -6 mile hike that includes the connected Devils Slide trail there is hiking for all ages and skill.

This will be a MERRY event for young and young at heart, with hot cider, snacks and cheer, and plenty of surprises too. It just might make the best memories of the Holiday season!

Participants should check in at the Castle Kitchen and Bath parking lot between 10am and 1.00pm and plan to return no later than 2pm. You will be safely transported to and from the Pedro Point Headlands staging area. Long sleeve shirts, pants and sturdy shoes are recommended. Evergreen and natural materials will be available for you to take home for decorations or wreaths. Due to the wonderful success of the previous Charlie Brown Tree events, there are few if any trees suitable even for Charlie Brown so this year we will appreciate the native plants instead.

Hiking to some of the bluffs for the spectacular views of the ocean, Devils Slide, Shelter Cove and beyond can be quite rigorous but usually considered well worth it.
